

## **Learner Licence Assistance Program (LLAP)**

Learner Licence Assistance Programs (LLAPs) provide assistance for people who are attempting to secure a Learner Licence. The program, which was first developed several years ago, has now been widely implemented across most of Tasmania.

The program targets people who experience difficulty obtaining a Learner Licence through the conventional process at Service Tasmania outlets. People with low literacy, those who left school early, people not confident with computers and migrants from non-English speaking backgrounds all benefit from LLAP.

LLAPs operate through educational, employment and community service organisations. These organisations identify suitable clients, both youth and adult, and support them, either individually or in a familiar group setting, to acquire the knowledge to pass the Learner Driver Knowledge Test.

A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is issued by DIER to participating organisations which authorises the conduct of the Learner Driver Knowledge Test for clients in their familiar setting. With the support of DIER a certificate is given to the successful client recognising that they have passed the test and they can then go to a Service Tasmania outlet to obtain their Learner Licence.

DIER has now established MOUs with over 50 organisations throughout Tasmania.

NB LLAPs are not designed for mainstream clients, who are still referred through the usual Service Tasmania procedure to sit the test.
