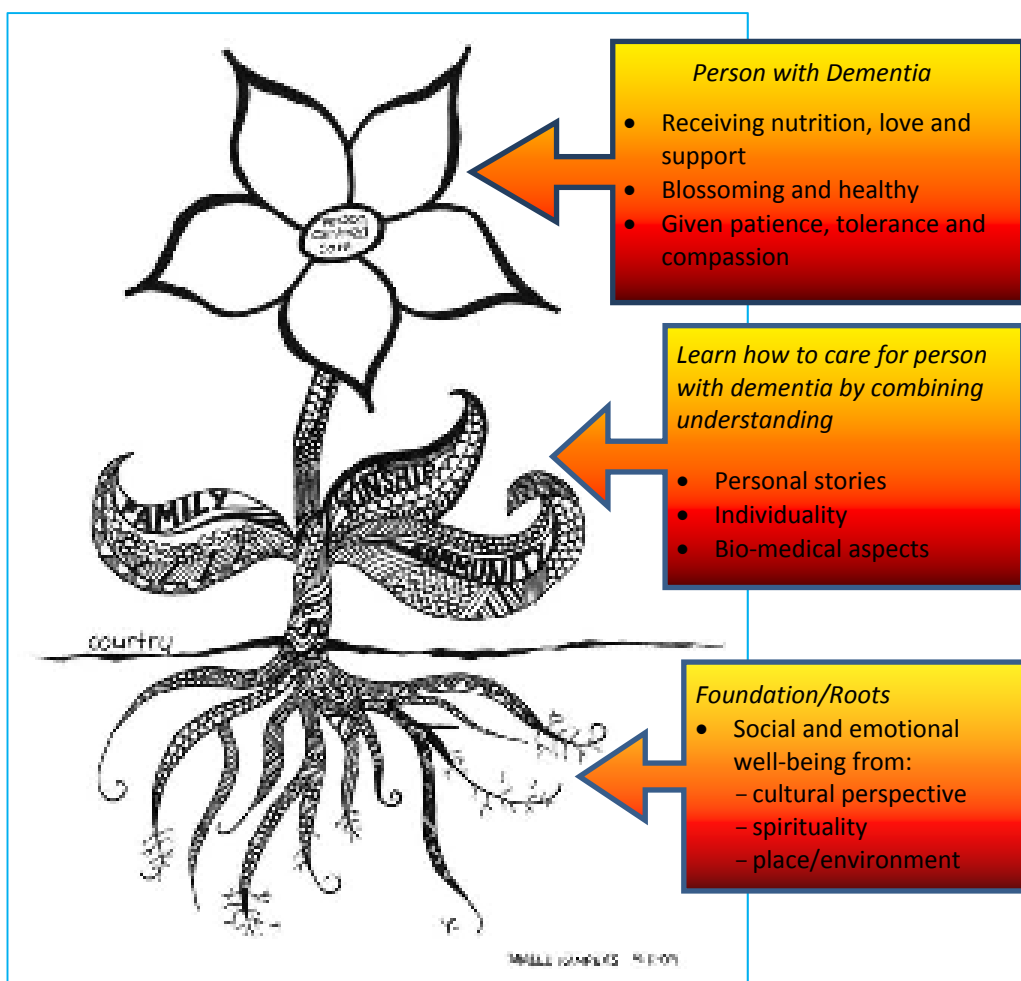
How is the content presented?

- **Online**
 - Ease of access for undergraduates and postgraduates (Any time, Any Place)
 - Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander specific content is not necessarily part of core course content, yet it is core business when practising
 - Practising clinicians disseminate link through professional network

 - Provides practical application for clinicians, students and service providers

 - Nursing
 - Holistic



WHY an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander specific module?

- Unique and diverse
- Cultural perspectives
- Current social determinants
- Past colonial policies
- Higher prevalence rate
- Cultural safety improving clinician practice and health outcomes

- Feedback generated from online evaluation:
 - demographic profile of users
 - open ended responses
 - likert scale items about appropriateness and usefulness of resource
