


The Road, My Mob and Me

Visit an authorised restraint fitter to keep our children safe in the car. Fitters ensure restraints meet the Australian standard and are correctly installed.





“To keep safe I always wear my helmet when I ride my bike or scooter”

Check your child’s helmet fits correctly, and encourage them to wear a helmet when riding wheeled toys and bikes.



“Always ask a grown-up where it is safe for you to play”



Make sure our children play in safe places away from traffic and water. Grown-ups are responsible for supervising play.



“I always cross the road with a grown-up”

When our children are walking near roads, footpaths, driveways and car parks hold their hands until they are at least 8 years old.
