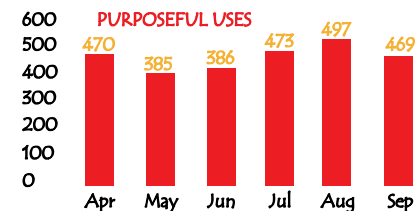

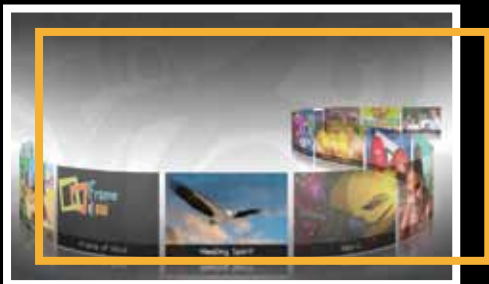

What you need

1. A good place to put your kiosk – out of direct sunlight, where it's visible but tucked away so that people feel comfortable using it
2. Power Point – out of sight behind the kiosk, preferably with childproof cover
3. Data Point – out of sight behind kiosk. Internet connection is essential for ongoing service and access to the kiosk.
4. A place to put the HITnet poster that comes with your kiosk – it invites people to use it and lets them know they can use their ear phones for privacy

SEXUAL HEALTH

1. *Put It On* – an interactive story of choice & consequence, a safe sex film was made with the people of Napranum, Cape York.
2. *Kaiya Girl* – filmed in Broome, this story helps young people to see the impact that drugs and alcohol have on their ability to make safe sex decisions.
3. *Risky Business* – serious game about the risks associated with unsafe sex.
4. *Condoman* – the return of this much loved figure encourages the use of condoms in an engaging animated story.

MENTAL HEALTH

1. *Healing Spirit* – a story of community renewal after a spate of suicides, from the people of Yarrabah near Cairns.
2. *Frame of Mind* – mental health music videos made in Old communities.
3. *Free the Warriors Within* – motivational stories for men who are *doing time* and *have the time* to make positive changes in their lives.
4. *Deadly Choices & Solid Decisions* – information to assist Qld Offenders going before the Mental Health Review Tribunal.
5. *Creative Recovery* – stories from artists and workers involved in an 'Art in Health' initiative in Lockhart River.
6. *Changing Ways* – healing stories from Aurukun based on the narrative therapy approach.

1. *Deadly Dinners* – cooking show based on the *Go for 2 & 5* campaign.

CULTURAL DOCUMENTARIES

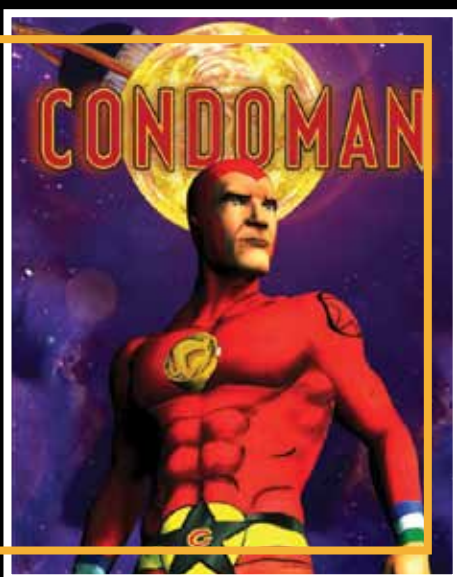
1. *Lockhart River Bush Tucker* – elders sharing their knowledge in the wet and dry seasons.
2. *Community Stories* – children's animation of a Dreamtime story.

KID'S HEALTH

1. *Deadly Kids* – health info for kids with a popular interactive game.
2. *Granny, why don't you smoke?* – a historical animation about tobacco use.

GENERAL HEALTH

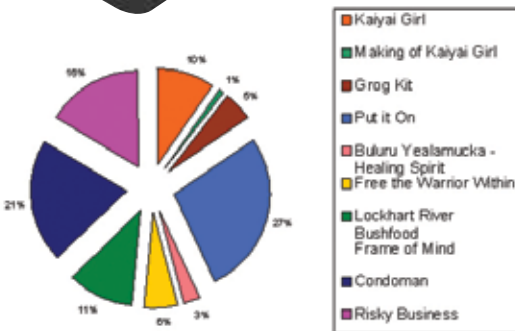
1. *Keeping Strong* – info for Carers about what they do and how to get support.
2. *Carers Respite* – video stories for Carers on the importance of respite.
3. *Rheumatic Fever* – focuses on prevention and compliance with treatment for young people.
4. *Looking after your Breasts* – breast cancer awareness, includes 4 women's stories.
5. *You Don't Want to Mess With Me* – street art inspired hip hop animation about Hepatitis C.
6. *Health Heroes* – stories from health professionals encouraging young people to take up careers in health.
